## **MCFD and CLBC plan transition for children's services**

In June of this year the provincial government announced changes in ministry responsibilities. Responsibility for services previously delivered to children and families by Community Living British Columbia (CLBC) has moved to the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD). CLBC continues to be responsible for the delivery of services to adults with developmental disabilities and their families. The government stated that CLBC and MCFD will work together to develop a transition process and to ensure there is no impact in services for families and stakeholders. In the interim period, CLBC continues to be the point of contact for families and children accessing supports and services currently provided by CLBC. Reach programs that require referrals through CLBC include Reach Positive Behavioural Support (PBS) and Reach Respite. Until the transition process from CLBC to MCFD takes place, PBS and Respite will continue to accept referrals through CLBC offices. ## **Government announces changes that affect eligibility of services for people with disabilities**

On July 24, 2008 the provincial government announced a change in the Community Living Authority Act requiring that service eligibility include only those individuals with an IQ of 70 or below. The rule change allows government to circumvent a B.C. Court of Appeal ruling that found the province had no authority to deny service eligibility to people because their IQ was above a certain threshold. This change will effect many individuals with developmental disabilities, in particular individuals with Autism or Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder, (FASD) many of whom have an IQ above 70.
