Reach ABA Program

The Reach ABA Program is for children with an autism spectrum disorder (ASD) living in Delta, Surrey or Langley. It is a skill-building program that uses the principles of Applied Behaviour Analysis to teach young children with ASD functional communication, play, social interaction, academic, fine motor and self-help skills.

Reach ABA Program for Children Under 6

The Reach ABA Program is a highly structured intervention program that uses teaching methods such as Discrete Trial Training (DTT) and Natural Teaching Strategies (NTS). DTT incorporates errorless learning, prompting and reinforcement. NTS is based on the child's interest and incorporates choices, reinforcing materials, and reinforcing consequences.

The Reach ABA Program offers two options: Centre-based ABA or Home based ABA.



Behaviour Plan of Intervention

A Behavioural Consultant will coordinate the development of the child's Behaviour Plan of Intervention (BPI), covering all child development domains.

Option 1: Centre-Based ABA Program

- Children receive 40 hours of one-to-one intervention each month at a Reach ABA centre. Intervention times are 9:00-11:30 or 12:00-2:30 or 2:45-5:15
- Reach centres are located in Ladner, North Delta and Cloverdale.
- The child's team includes a behaviour consultant, an associate behaviour consultant, a speech-language pathologist, an occupational therapist and a behaviour interventionist.



Option 2: Home-Based ABA Program

- Children receive 30 hours of one-to-one intervention each month in their own home.
- The child's team consists of a Behaviour Consultant, an Associate Behaviour Consultant, and a Behaviour Interventionist. Families may add a Reach Speech-Language Pathologist and/or Occupational Therapist to the team and additional behaviour interventionist hours.
- Program materials are provided.

Reach ABA Program for Children Over 6

Consultation services from a Behaviour Consultant, Speech-Language Pathologist and Occupational Therapist may be available depending on the child's needs/goals and staff availability.
