REACH Autism Program

The REACH Autism Program is designed to help children learn skills to develop their independence that will allow them to participate in a positive way in family activities, school and their community.

Overview

Each child and family is unique and requires a different combination of services to achieve their goals.

Our team will help you identify goals and learn with your child.

Current research tells us that children learn best when they practice skills in context with their family, and with other children



Children will learn:

- Communication and interaction skills when they practice with family members
- Self-care skills like toileting, dressing and teeth brushing when they practice with their parents in home routines
- Positive behaviors and emotional regulation when they participate in family, school and community activities
- Social skills when they can practice with peers

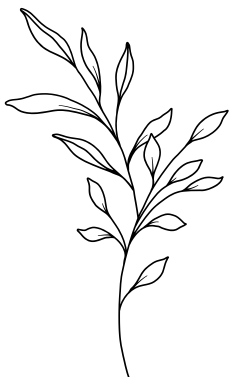


Support

Our team of autism service providers includes Behaviour Consultants (BC), Speech-Language Pathologists (SLP), Occupational Therapists (OT), Associate Behaviour Consultants (ABC), and Autism Interventionists (AI).

We have four different service options to meet the needs of children and their families.

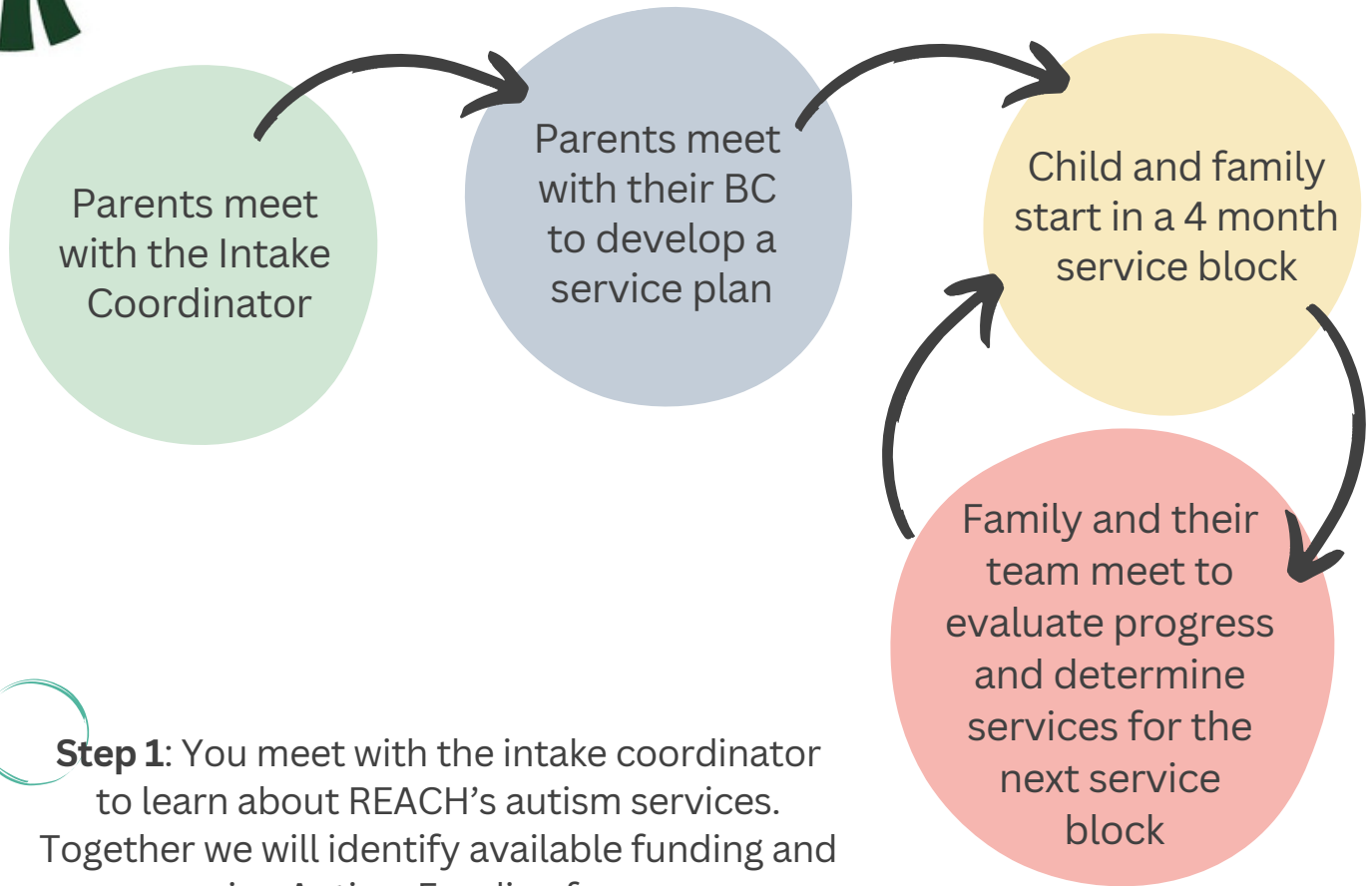
All our service options are offered in four month blocks. This provides flexibility to move from one type of service to another when your child's goals are updated and changed.

Service Path



Step 1: You meet with the intake coordinator to learn about REACH’s autism services. Together we will identify available funding and sign Autism Funding forms.

Step 2: Next, we develop the service plan. We start by meeting you and your child and gathering information about your strengths, needs, and priorities. This helps us jointly choose the best service options for you.

Step 3: You will start in a 4 month service block. At the beginning we develop a learning plan for your child. The plan has individualized goals for your child and family. At the end of the service block we meet to evaluate progress and update the plan. Families may then choose to continue in the same type of service, or they may choose a different service to help their child learn skills in a different setting.



REACH Autism Program

School Readiness

Description

- Each child will have an individualized learning plan
- Children learn in a group of 5-6 peers
- The group is run by a BC, SLP, and OT
- One to two Autism Interventionists (AIs) will assist by supporting children in the group

Hours

- Children attend twice a week Mon/Wed or Tue/Thu
- Children attend for 4 hours per week for a 4 month block (2 hours each session)
- Blocks are Sep-Dec and Jan-Apr

Learning Areas and Goals

- Social Skills: Children learn to communicate, interact and cooperate with other children
- Executive Functioning: Children learn flexibility, organization, self-monitoring, planning and problem solving
- Regulation: Children learn to regulate their emotions
- Academics: Children learn reading, counting, drawing and printing skills

Requirements

To benefit from this group, children need to be able to:

- Understand and follow directions
- Make choices
- Sit at the table for activities
- Play with toys
- Participate in activities with peers when supported
- Move from one activity to the next when supports are in place

Requirements

To benefit from this group, children need to:

- Understand and follow some directions
- Make choices
- Stay with the group for activities

Requirements

Children do not need any specific skills to participate in this program.

Parents need to be available for all appointments with their child to learn teaching procedures





REACH Autism Program

Little Steps

Description

- Each child will have an individualized learning plan
- Children learn 1:1 at a Reach Centre
- Parent participation is required for some goal areas
- All teaching is done by an AI, based on instructions provided by a BC and an SLP or OT
- The child's BC, SLP/OT each observes one session per month to update goals and teaching strategies
- The child's ABC attends one session per month

Hours

- Children attend twice a week Mon/Wed or Tue/Thu at a Reach Centre
- Children attend for 4 hours per week for a 4 month block (2 hours each session)
- Blocks are Sep-Dec, Jan-Apr, and May-Aug

Learning Areas and Goals

- Children learn skills in 3-4 areas from an AI.
- Parent participation is required to transfer some skills from the centre to home routines. Families choose goals from the following areas:
- Concepts and early academics
 - Toy play and interactions
 - Fine motor skills including colouring, cutting, drawing and printing
- Parent participation is required for these goals
- Communication
 - Toileting
 - Dressing
 - Tolerating self-care routines (teeth brushing, hair cutting, nail trimming)
 - Eating a variety of foods
 - Emotional regulation

Requirements

Children do not need any specific skills to participate in this program. Parents need to be available:

- For additional appointments to learn how to transfer their child's skills to home routines

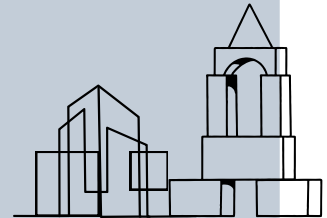

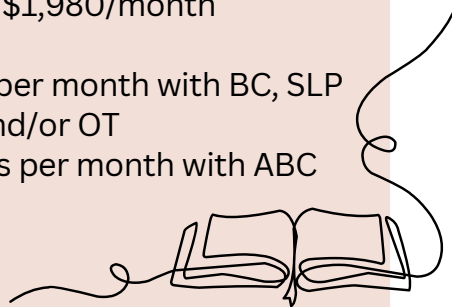

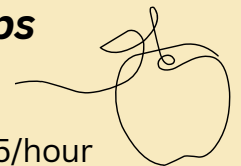
