I refer you to our enclosed audited statements prepared by Cran and Company for the Reach Foundation. As of March 31, 2018 \$5,472,143 has been capitalized in the Society for the building. With receivables including the 2018-19 events REACH Foundation will have raised \$5,655,563.13, the full funding needed to complete the capital campaign!

I would like to personally thank our FIND volunteers, Reach's Events Committee and their many volunteers, Kristin Bibbs Reach's highly capable Development Manager, and Alison Martin our vibrant Marketing Manager. 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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the members of **Reach Child and Youth Development Charitable Foundation**:

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Reach Child and Youth Development Charitable Foundation ("the Foundation"), which comprise the statement of financial position as at March 31, 2018, the statement of operations and changes in net assets and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's responsibility for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control.

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

In common with many charitable organizations, the Foundation derives a part of its revenue from donations and special events, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, my verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Foundation. Therefore I am not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to donation or special events revenue, deficiency of revenues over expenses, and cash flows from operations for the year ended March 31, 2018, current assets, total assets, current liabilities, total liabilities and total liabilities and net assets as at March 31, 2018.

Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis of Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Reach Child and Youth Development Charitable Foundation as at March 31, 2018, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

As required the BC Societies Act, I report that, in my opinion, the accounting principles Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profits organizations have been applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

1. NATURE OF ORGANIZATION

The Reach Child and Youth Development Charitable Foundation was incorporated under the Society Act of British Columbia on December 13, 2007.

Reach Child and Youth Development Charitable Foundation's primary duty is to receive, hold and invest bequests, donations, gifts, funds and property and to administer and distribute these funds as needed to support the programs and activities of the Reach Child and Youth Development Society. Currently, the primary focus of the foundation is to accumulate funds for the Building Project, referred to in note 3.

Reach Child and Youth Development Charitable Foundation is a registered charity and as such is exempt from Income Tax.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash consists of cash on deposit with banks and highly liquid short term interest bearing securities with maturities of three months or less.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the reporting date and the reported amounts of receipts and disbursements for the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates. Significant financial statement items that require the use of estimates are as follows: amount of accrued liabilities, and the useful life of capital assets. These estimates are reviewed periodically and adjustments are made, as appropriate, in the statement of operations and changes in fund balances in the year they become known.

Investments

Investment in the publicly traded equity securities is recorded based on quoted market prices. Unrealized gains or losses are recognized in the statement of operations. Transaction costs, such as commissions, arising from investments in publicly traded equity securities are expensed when incurred.

Revenue recognition

The Foundation follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions.

Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the Building Fund in the year received or receivable if the amount to be recorded can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Unrestricted investment income is recognized as revenue of the Building Fund when earned.

Pledges are recognized when the amount to be received is reasonably estimated and the ultimate collection is reasonably assured.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES con't

Contributed services

Because of the difficulty of determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements. A total of 1,306 volunteer hours (1,333 in 2017) were contributed to the Foundation for this fiscal year.

3. BUILDING PROJECT

In May 2010, the directors voted to work towards construction of a building to house the Reach Child and Youth Development Society operations ("the building project"). All funds collected through the foundation have been realized as revenue into the building fund. As of March 31, 2018 \$5,472,143 has been capitalized in the Society for the building. The Foundation has committed to collect all outstanding pledges and additional donations to a total of \$600,000 in order to fully fund the project.

This project involves the Corporation of Delta, Reach Child and Youth Development Society and the Ladner Tsawwassen Kinsmen Club. The Corporation of Delta has provided the land, which is valued in excess of \$1 million and will lease it to the Society at a \$1 per year for 30 years and options for renewal.

6. DUE TO RELATED PARTY

As defined by ASNPO, the Foundation is related to Reach Child and Youth Development Society by way of both a common board member and the Executive Director.

Amounts due from the Reach Child and Youth Development Society are non-interest bearing and have no fixed terms for repayment. The two parties are related in that the Foundation's primary duty is to receive, hold and invest funds and property and to administer and distribute these funds as needed to support the programs and activities of the Society. Currently, the primary focus of the foundation is to accumulate funds for the Building Project.

8. EXPENSES

All of the administration and staff expenses relating to the Foundation's operations and the special events are borne by the Society.

9. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Foundation uses risk management to monitor and manage its risk arising from financial instruments.

These risks include credit risk, interest rate risk, liquidity risk and market risk.

The Foundation does not use any derivative financial instruments to mitigate these risks.

Credit risk

Credit risks arise from the following sources: cash and cash equivalents, and accounts receivable. Cash and cash equivalents are deposited with reputable, major financial institutions to limit the credit risk exposure. The credit risk from donors not paying accounts receivable is not considered to be significant. The investments include investments issued by high-credit quality financial institutions, and we consider the risk of non-performance of these instruments to be remote.

Interest rate risk

The Foundation is exposed to interest rate risk with respect to the following financial instruments: cash and cash equivalents, and investments in interest bearing securities. Changes in interest rates can affect the fair value of investments and the cash flows related to interest income.

Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk exposure is dependent on the receipt of funds from donor funds and other sources to enable the Foundation to pay its liabilities as they become due.

Market risk

The Foundation is exposed to market risk as the investments in publicly traded securities are subject to fluctuations due to price changes on the market. The prices can also be affected by changes in interest rates and foreign currency exchange rates.

10. CAPITAL MANAGEMENT

The Foundations's objective when managing capital is to safeguard the entity's ability to continue as a going concern, so that it can continue to provide services to the community in the form of supporting the Reach Child and Youth Development Society .

The Foundation sets the amount of capital in proportion to risk and manages the capital structure and makes adjustments to it in light of changes to economic conditions and the risk characteristics of the underlying assets.
