Reach Child and Youth Development Society holds the three-year accreditation for Community Services: Child and Youth Services, and Community Services: Respite Services. CARF (The Commission of Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities).

Reach Infant Development Program

The Infant Development Program is a voluntary home visiting program that provides a range of family-centered services to families of children birth to age 3 who may be at risk for, or have a developmental delay, or have a diagnosed disability. There is no cost to receive services.

Reach IDP provides services that support your goals for your child and family. It assists you in getting information about your child's overall development, identifying the changes you would like to see happen as a result of being a part of the IDP program and developing strategies to encourage your child's development within your family's everyday routines and activities. IDP can also help you learn about and access community resources and IDP groups and workshops.

Benefits of an Infant Development Program



Families play a vital role in every child's development. From birth to three years a child develops at a rapid pace. Physical, social, emotional, behavioural,

communication and intellectual development depend in part on experiences provided with the infant's family.

The IDP provides an opportunity for your baby to become more independent, discover his/her abilities, and learn new skills. As a parent the IDP provides you with an opportunity to learn ways to encourage your child's development, meet other parents, discuss parenting issues, and make optimum use of other community resources. Infant Development Consultants are professionals. They have skills and knowledge in child development and can assist you to enhance your child's development in these important years.

Part of the Community

Reach IDP works in partnership with other professionals in the community. These include public health nurse, physiotherapist and occupational therapist, speech and language pathologist, Dr. or Pediatrician, preschool/daycare personnel, hospital professionals, social workers, behavior consultants, supported child development consultants and more.



Referrals

Referrals to Reach IDP may come from any source such as your doctor, public health nurse, community professional or may be made by you, the parent, as a self-referral. Your participation is voluntary and free of charge. Reach IDP is supported by the Ministry for Children and Families.

Waitlist

Each child and family presents a unique situation, the urgency of which is to be assessed in relation to others on the waitlist. The following considerations are reviewed when determining the provision of consultation services: transfer from another program, the degree of developmental delay, age of the child, family situation and other services being accessed. While on the waitlist for an IDP Consultant, a family will receive an initial waitlist consultation to help determine their needs. They are also able to access IDP group activities. Families can contact the Infant Development Program Coordinator if they have any questions.
