



Reach Positive Connections Program

The Reach Positive Connections program provides service to families in Delta Surrey, White Rock and Langley with children or youth with special needs. It is a free, family-centred program with 3 key components designed to provide families with short term service, focused on parent education and connecting with community resources and support.

The Reach Positive Connections program 3 key components are:

1. Parent Education Classes: Parents attend small group classes with other parents who have similar life situations. Classes focus on parenting skills, managing challenging behaviours, teaching life and social skills and other topics related to best supporting the development of children with developmental



disabilities. There will be a total of 18 hours of classes that will be run over several weeks.

Parents have a choice of day or evening classes and child minding is available while parents attend classes in the evening.

2: In home Behaviour Consultation. Parents meet with an experienced Behaviour

Consultant in their home to jointly develop a plan to address areas of need or priority. Consultants will assist families in applying the class information in their own lives. Families will need to set aside time to work with their consultant. The consultant will visit from 8 to a maximum of 14 times, depending on family needs and progress. Visits will be used to assess the areas of priority, to develop plans and strategies, to coach families and assist them to become comfortable with their new parenting strategies, to monitor progress and modify strategies as needed, and to develop maintenance strategies for when service ends.

3: Sibling Support Group. This component provides support to siblings of children with special needs. It is a group based on the "sibshops" model that supports and educates, while providing a forum for siblings to meet and share experiences. This

program is offered during the summer and will include outings, making it a camp type experience for siblings. We also offer an ongoing sib group sponsored by FortisBC.

Positive Connections Philosophy Statement

Positive Connections draws upon research based practices to assist families to: reduce or prevent problem behaviours with a focus on a proactive approach; support the optimal development of their child; and to enhance the quality of life for their child and themselves.
