At Reach we believe in the potential of every child and we know that each child is unique. We work together with families to recognize each child's strengths and develop their abilities.



Reach Child and Youth Development Society holds the three-year accreditation for Community Services: Child and Youth Services, and Community Services: respite Services. CARF (The Commission of Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities).

Reach Supported Child Development

Reach Supported Child Development provides support for children from birth to age 19 who require extra support and are, or will be, attending a child care setting in Delta.

In order to be effectively included within a child care setting it is recognized that some children may require extra support. Some children may need support due to a delay or difficulty in some area of development.

Other children may demonstrate some need for support that has not yet been identified.

Reach Supported Child Development works with families and child care providers to meet individual needs.

The Supported Child Development Consultant visits the child care setting

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and provides a range of other supports such as team meetings with other professionals to identify the child's support needs.



Consultant, families and their child care setting determine how often visits are needed, from once a week to once every few months. Where children require a greater level of support, extra staffing to the child care setting will be pursued in conjunction with Consultant support.

Benefits of Supported Child Development

Supported Child Development provides help with families choosing a child care setting, individual planning and staff support to meet child specific needs, ways for families to connect with other families through supports like parent groups, and information and access

to equipment, resources and toys. Supported Child Development Consultants also provide consultation on areas such as promoting effective inclusion, behavioural support, and adapting or structuring the environment to meet specific needs.

Part of the Community

Families choose a child care setting that best meets their needs and those of their child. Support is then provided to this setting through the Reach Supported Child Development Program. Possible child care settings include preschools, group child care, family child care, out of school care, Licensed Not Required child care, or in own home.
